Target Shooting Procedure Form



The following are the provisions under **Town Ordinance 2015-07** which cover target shooting in the Musquash. It is understood that the person upon receipt of this form reads and understands all the provisions and referenced information as noted below.

- Target shooting shall be allowed in the Musquash only during turkey and deer hunting seasons by muzzleloader or firearms as limited and established by New Hampshire Fish and Game (<http://www.wildlife.state.nh.us/>) and only by those who have a valid New Hampshire Fish & Game license and have followed a check in procedure with the Londonderry Police Department.

Authorized firearms are restricted to:

- Muzzleloaders
 - Shotguns
 - Pistol or rifle chambered for .22 caliber rimfire only
- There shall be caliber restrictions on all weapons used for target shooting equivalent to those allowed by New Hampshire Statute (Title XVIII) and NH Fish & Game Department Rule (Chapter Fis 300) for hunting deer and turkey in Londonderry, New Hampshire.

Deer season caliber restrictions are as follows:

- Muzzleloader: no less than .40 caliber
- Shotgun: no shell shot, other than those using shot sizes of 00 buckshot or Larger
- Pistol or rifle chambered for .22 caliber rimfire only

Turkey season caliber restrictions are as follows:

- Shotgun: Only between 10 and 20 gauge with shot size of #2 and smaller
- Pistol or rifle chambered for .22 caliber rimfire only

- The protective shooting radius stated in RSA 207:3-a (“It is unlawful for a person to discharge a firearm...within 300 feet of a permanently occupied dwelling without permission of the owner or the occupant of the dwelling or from the owner of the land on which the person discharging the firearm is situated.”) **shall be extended from 300 feet to twice that distance at 600 feet.**
- Anyone violating a provision of this **Town Ordinance 2015-07** shall be guilty of a violation.
 - A person’s first violation shall be punishable of a fine of not less than one hundred dollars (\$100.00).
 - A person’s second violation shall be punishable of a fine of not less than two hundred and fifty dollars (\$250.00).
 - A person’s third violation shall be punishable of a fine of not less than one thousand dollars (\$1000.00).
